

San Antonio Canyon Town Hall presents
59th Annual Mt. Baldy Run-to-the-Top, Labor Day Trail Race, Sept. 2, 2024



Events:

- The 59th annual Mt. Baldy Run-to-the-Top (RTTT), one of the most popular and challenging mountain trail races in California, will be held in the Angeles National Forest on Mt. Baldy on 9/2/24. This is a fundraiser for San Antonio Canyon (Mt. Baldy) Town Hall. The RTTT covers 7+ miles with 4,000' of elevation gain. The final mile, the steepest, is above timberline, and the finish is on the summit of beautiful Mt. Baldy at 10,064'. The race is timed.
- Awards ceremony starts at approximately 11:30, outside of the Notch restaurant at the top of the ski lift.

Times: The RTTT starts at 8 am at the top of Mt. Baldy Rd. and finishes at 11 am on the summit of Mt. Baldy.

Registration:

- RTTT registration is \$75 online thru 8/31/24, and \$80 onsite 9/2/24, unless sold out.
- **Online** registration thru 8/31/24, on <http://ultrasignup.com>.
- **Onsite** registration on 9/2/24 (race day). Payment: cash, check or credit.

- No Refunds – No Roll-overs – No Transfers – No Exceptions.

Included with registration:

- Poly/cotton shirt (shirt size is not guaranteed after 8/15/24)
- Parking at the Ski Lifts
- Finisher medal only at the finish line. Late finishers are not guaranteed a medal.

Not included with registration: Ski lift ride to the parking lot. Historically, the Lifts provides an online discount.

Packet Pick-up:

- **Race Day:** 9/2/24, at the start line, at the top of Mt. Baldy Rd., from 6:15 am – 7:45 am

Aid Stations:

- There are four aid stations (approx. 2 miles apart) with water, fruit and chips at the 3rd station.
- The summit water station will also offer Gatorade.
- Medical: Fire Department EMTs and Search & Rescue are positioned all along the course and at the aid stations.

Purpose: Fundraiser

The funds from the Run-to-the-Top allow Town Hall to contribute to projects that benefit the entire Mt. Baldy community, to maintain an emergency fund for disaster relief, and to make annual donations to the Mt. Baldy School, the all-volunteer Mt. Baldy Fire Department, and the all-volunteer West Valley Search & Rescue. The latter two organizations provide emergency services during the race, with personnel positioned at the four aid/water stations and along the course. Town Hall's donations to the Fire Department and West Valley also benefit the thousands of weekly visitors who hike, bike, and play in the local wilderness. Each year, 20% of the race proceeds is added to a perpetual grant for the Mt. Baldy Fire Department to aid with capital expenditures and a planned expansion.
